This has reference to Regional Memorandum ESSD-2025-021 re: **Third Advisory for the Implementation of the School-Based Feeding Program (SBFP) FY 2025**, providing new instructions regarding the implementation of the School-Based Feeding Program (SBFP) for FY 2025.

The SBFP for FY 2024 allotted funds for 15 feeding days intended to be implemented during SY 2024-2025 NLC. However, in view of DO No. 10, s. 2025, "Guidelines for the implementation of the 2025 Department of Education Summer Programs", similar and/or alternative programs are to be implemented during the summer break of 2025.

With this, procured commodities allotted for the conduct of SBFP during SY 2024-2025 NLC shall be distributed to all wasted/severely wasted Kindergarten to Grade 6 learners of SY 2024-2025 on **May 19 to June 6, 2025**.

Further, the School Health and Nutrition Section shall monitor the implementation of the said distribution.

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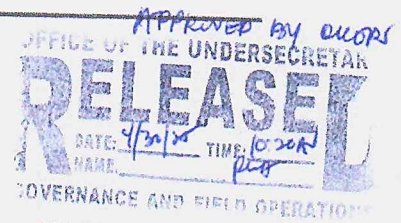

SUBJECT : THIRD ADVISORY FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE
SCHOOL-BASED FEEDING PROGRAM (SBFP) FY 2025

DATE : April 15, 2025

This Advisory provides new instructions regarding the implementation of the School-Based Feeding Program (SBFP) for FY 2025.

1. Conduct of SBFP during National Learning Camp (NLC) and other similar and/or alternative programs for SY 2024-2025

The SBFP for FY 2024 allotted funds for 15 feeding days intended to be implemented during SY 2024-2025 NLC. However, in view of DO. No. 10, s. 2025, "Guidelines for the Implementation of the 2025 Department of Education Summer Programs", similar and/or alternative programs are to be implemented during the summer break of 2025. In view thereof, the regions and SDOs are hereby authorized to proceed with either of the following steps:

- a. Schools Division Offices (SDOs) that will conduct the National Learning Camp and other similar and/or alternative summer programs for SY 2024-2025 may continue to implement the SBFP as guided by instructions issued from OM-OUOPS-2024-09-10424, "1st Advisory for the Implementation of the School-Based Feeding Program (SBFP) FY 2025 or may defer the feeding implementation during SY 2025-2026.
- b. SDOs that will not implement the National Learning Camp and other similar and/or alternative summer programs for SY 2024-2025 may proceed with either of the following steps:

i. Implementation during SY 2025-2026

Funds and procured commodities allotted for the conduct of SBFP during SY 2024-2025 NLC may be used to provide fortified foods and/or

meals to the identified/intended beneficiaries of SY 2024-2025 during SY 2025-2026.

ii. Distribution of Food Commodities during Summer Break

Funds and procured commodities allotted for the conduct of SBFP during SY 2024-2025 NLC may also be distributed to the households of intended beneficiaries during the summer break of 2025. Close coordination and assistance from the barangay and other local government units (LGUs) and partners may be made to strategize the distribution and delivery of food items.

The SDOs/Schools are permitted to employ temporary laborers, helpers, or assistants for the delivery of food packs at reasonable costs, which will be charged against the school's operational expenses or the SDO-PSF.

- c. SDOs shall ensure that FY 2024 funds allotted for hot meals and/or nutritious food products (NFP) and milk shall be used only for the procurement of food commodities for intended beneficiaries of SY 2024-2025.

2. Extension of SBFP Milk Feeding during the NLC

As additional catch up with the delayed implementation for SY 2024-2025 experienced by some SDOs, they may extend the delivery of milk from **May to June 2025** with the following conditions:

- a. the supplied milk recommended is **sterilized** for quality assurance.;
- b. **one-time delivery** of the Milk Supplier to the drop-off points; and
- c. **one-time distribution** to the SY 2024-2025 Milk beneficiaries.

The SDOs/Schools are permitted to employ temporary laborers, helpers, or assistants for the delivery of food packs at reasonable costs, which will be charged against the school's operational expenses or the SDO-PSF.

In case the NDA and PCC-assisted suppliers fail to provide the milk requirements, the SDO may procure other milk products using Competitive Bidding or other forms of Negotiated Procurement as per RA No. 9184 or RA No. 12009.

All SDOs are encouraged to fully consume FY 2024 Funds until June 2025 and utilize FY 2025 funds for School Year 2025-2026.

3. Transmittal of FY 2025 Milk Supply Map

The attached FY 2025 Milk Supply Map (Annex A), which was an output of the "School-Based Feeding Program NFP and Milk Suppliers' Expo and Mapping FY 2025," shall be used by all SDOs as the Procuring Entity (PE) for the SBFP Milk Component. SDOs with recommendations for CM shall be allowed to

procure commercial powdered/sterilized milk, subject to the following pre-requisites:

- a. Written request from the Schools Division Office (SDO) to the Regional Office (RO) seeking approval of the procurement of commercial milk (CM) with justification; and
- b. The RO, through the SBFP Focal Person, shall validate if these areas are indeed far-flung/inaccessible and provide a recommendation to proceed with the procurement of CM.

Once approved by the Regional Office, the SDO may proceed with the procurement process of CM.

4. Transmittal of NDA and PCC FY 2025 Raw Milk Supply Map and Plant Processing Capacities

In light of the anticipated delays in the submission of FY 2025 Milk Supply Commitment from the National Dairy Authority and Philippine Carabao Center, attached Letter from NDA and PCC (Annex B) shall be used as reference by all SDOs for the procurement of milk. SDOs are encouraged to write to and coordinate with the NDA Field Offices and PCC Regional Offices to seek possible suppliers, identify the implementation period for SY 2025-2026, and proceed with the procurement of milk through Negotiated Procurement-Community Participation.

Three (3) batches of milk implementation have been identified as follows:

Batch 1: July 14 to August 22, 2025

Batch 2: August 25 to October 3, 2025

Batch 3: October 6 to Nov. 14, 2025

All SDOs are expected to observe the set implementation period for the regular and milk components. If the NDA/PCC fails to respond within **one (1) month** to the request for Certification of Community Social Groups (CSGs) from the date they received the letter, the SDOs may explore alternative means to provide milk to the beneficiaries to comply within the implementation period.

1. This has reference to Regional Memorandum ESSD-2025-004 re: Dissemination of the First Advisory for the Implementation of the School-Based Feeding Program (SBFP) FY 2025. Please see attached for reference.

2. The following updates and instructions are hereby issued:

i. Revised Target Beneficiaries for Milk

The target beneficiaries for milk shall cover **ONLY** all kindergarten beneficiaries and severely wasted Grades 1-3 learners. If there is still excess, include the secondary beneficiaries as stated in DO No. 31, s. 2021.

ii. Revised Number of Feeding Days

The number of feeding days for Hot meals/NFP shall be **120 days** while for the Milk shall be **15 days**. The revision of the number of feeding days are adjusted with the universal feeding of kindergarten.

iii. Removal of Service fee for the Coordination with National Dairy Authority (NDA) and Philippine Carabao Center (PCC)

Starting SY 2024-2025, the DepEd will no longer pay Service Fee to NDA and PCC

iv. Guidelines for the Conduct of Feeding During the National Learning Camp

a. Priority shall be given to all wasted/severely wasted Kindergarten to Grade 6 learners

- b. In case of excess of funds following a, beneficiaries may include all Kindergarten learners in schools with the highest number of W/SW learners based on percentage of enrollment.
- c. In case of excess funds following a and b, beneficiaries may include all other learners who participate in the National Learning Camps.
- d. In case of excess of funds following a,b, and c, SDOs may extend the number of feeding days or do double feeding.

v. Inclusion of Brown Rice in the Options for Nutritious Food Products (NFP)

In addition to Iron-Fortified Rice (IFR), Brown Rice shall be served once a week to support local rice producers. The provision of brown rice-based NFPs, such as the Brown Nutty Fruity Bar developed by DOST-FNRI and other similar products, is strongly encouraged.

Both IFR and Brown Rice are required to be served either as part of hot meals or as stand-alone commodities when NFPs are distributed, unless supply availability is limited, as confirmed by a market survey conducted by SDO.

When distributed as NFP, each pack must contain 250 grams of IFR or BR. For hot meals, 85 grams of IFR or BR per serving is required, to be cooked on-site at the school and served with an appropriate viand.

vi. Reiteration of the Scope of Work of Hired Contract of Service (CoS) Employee at the SDOs

Reminding to adhere to the Terms of Reference (TOR) for the hiring of COS, particularly that their task should be specific to the SBFP and other Nutrition and Hygiene Programs such as Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene in Schools (WASH) and Nutrition Sensitive Programs.

This Advisory provides new instructions regarding the implementation of the School-Based Feeding Program (SBFP) for Fiscal Year (FY) 2025. The following updates and instructions are hereby issued:

1. Revised Target Beneficiaries for Milk

The target beneficiaries for milk shall cover **ONLY** all kindergarten beneficiaries and severely wasted and wasted Grades 1-3 learners. If there is still excess, include the secondary beneficiaries as stated in D.O. No. 31, s. 2021. The priority of targeting all kindergarten is to develop their milk drinking habit at their age and be provided with the nourishment needed for their maximum growth potential. Attached is the Revised Breakdown of Funds for ready reference.

2. Revised Number of Feeding days

The number of feeding days for **Hot meals/NFP** shall be **120 days** while for the **Milk** shall be **15 days**. The revision of the number of feeding days are adjusted with the universal feeding of kindergarten.

3. Removal of Service Fee for the Coordination with the National Dairy Authority (NDA) and Philippine Carabao Center (PCC)

Starting **FY 2024-2025**, the DepEd will no longer pay Service Fee to NDA and PCC as discussed and agreed upon during the meeting with NDA and PCC in the Senate of the Philippines.

4. Guidelines for the Conduct of Feeding During the National Learning Camp

- a. Priority shall be given to all W/SW Kindergarten to Grade 6 Learners

- b. In case of excess of funds following a, beneficiaries may include all Kindergarten learners in schools with the highest number of W/SW learners based on percentage (%) of enrollment.
- c. In case of excess of funds following a and b, beneficiaries may include all other learners who participate in the National Learning Camps.
- d. In case of excess of funds following a, b, and c, SDOs may extend the number of feeding days or do double feeding.

5. Inclusion of Brown Rice in the Options for Nutritious Food Products (NFP)

In addition to Iron-Fortified Rice (IFR), Brown Rice will be served once a week to support local rice producers (e.g. every Monday). The provision of brown rice-based NFPs, such as the Brown Rice Nutty Arinity Bar developed by DOS, FNR and other similar products, is strongly encouraged.

Both IFR and Brown Rice are **required** to be served either as part of hot meals or as stand-alone commodities when NFPs are distributed, unless supply availability is limited, as confirmed by a market survey conducted by the SDO.

When distributed as an NFP, each pack must contain 250 grams of IFR or BR. For hot meals, 85 grams of IFR or BR per serving is required, to be cooked on-site at the school and served with an appropriate viand.

Attached for ready reference are the Technical Specifications for NFP and Milk for SY 2025-2026.

7. Reiteration of the Scope of Work of Hired Contract of Service (CoS) Employees at the Regional (ROs) and Schools Division Offices (SDOs)

All ROs and SDOs are reminded to adhere to the Terms of Reference (TOR) for the Hiring of CoS, particularly that their tasks should be specific to the SBHT and other Nutrition and Hygiene Programs, such as the Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene in Schools (WASH) and Nutrition Sensitive Programs.
