Subject: **2025 DIVISION-WIDE BSP CAMPOREE AND GSP ENCAMPMENT
FOR PANABO CITY SECONDARY SCHOOLS**

Date: September 26, 2025

DepEd Order 76 s.2012 sets the guidelines of Revitalizing Boy Scouts of the Philippines (BSP) as an effective co-curricular program in the leadership and value formation of every child. Consistent with the Department of Education's mission to develop the youth with exemplary character and leadership potential, this program continues to produce great leaders and responsible citizens of communities.

This gathering provides scouts with opportunities to acquire life skills, deepen their sense of patriotism, and strengthen the values of service, leadership, teamwork, and resilience. It also serves as a venue for developing 21st-century skills such as problem-solving, adaptability, environmental stewardship, and civic responsibility—aligned with the DepEd mission to nurture lifelong learners who are *makabansa, makatao, makakalikasan, and maka-Diyos*.

Panabo City Secondary School Heads Association (PASSHA) in its pursuit to provide an avenue for scouting activities, shall conduct a **Division-wide BSP Camporee and GSP Encampment** on November 6-8, 2025 at Cagangohan National High School.

This activity aims to:

- provide activities that foster discipline;
- promote interpersonal and social development;
- inculcate a sense of responsibility and love for God, country, and duty for others.

Participants in this activity are Public Schools District Supervisors of Secondary Cluster, Division BSP and GSP Coordinators, all secondary school heads/principals, outfit advisors, and scouts of secondary schools. School heads are reminded to assign an Officer In-Charge (OIC) and arrange the classes of teachers involved in this activity subject to no-disruption-of-classes policy stipulated in **DepEd Order No. 9 s. 2005** titled "**Instituting Measures to Increase Time-on-Task and**



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Time-on-Task and Ensuring Compliance Therewith. A one-day service credit shall be granted to teachers who will serve in this activity in accordance with **DepEd Order No. 013, s. 2024** on September 18, 2024, entitled *Revised Guidelines on the Grant of Vacation Service Credits (VSC) for Teachers*

Transportation, materials, and other expenses incurred in this activity shall be charged to the school MOOE and/or any available local funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
